

Sixers Center Samuel Dalembert and Comcast-Spectacor Foundation help support Haitian Relief Efforts

In response to the devastating earthquake in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, Philadelphia 76ers center Samuel Dalembert, presented a personal check of \$100,000 to Caryl M. Stern, President and CEO, of the U.S. Fund for UNICEF, to help aid relief efforts in Haiti, prior to the Philadelphia 76ers- Sacramento Kings game (January 15) at the Wachovia Center. In addition to his personal contribution, Dalembert, a native of Haiti, also pledged to match the amount of money donated by Sixers fans at the UNICEF table on the concourse during the game that night. The Comcast-Spectacor Foundation also made a major contribution to the fundraising initiative. "While I cannot begin to imagine what my friends and family are going through as they deal with this terrible tragedy, I will do everything that I can to help raise funds to aid in the relief efforts," said Dalembert.

"My heartfelt thanks to Samuel Dalembert and the Philadelphia 76ers for their generous contribution," said Stern. "This will help provide essential life-saving supplies to the people of Haiti, especially for the thousands of children most in need without shelter, clean water, and nutrition, and those separated from their parents in this disaster."

Over the years, Dalembert continues to dedicate himself to helping his community, both in Philadelphia and in Haiti. Dalembert received the NBA Community Assist Award last February in recognition of his outstanding efforts in the community and for his ongoing philanthropic and charitable work.

Born in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, Dalembert spent the first 14 years of his life in Haiti before moving to Montreal, QUE. He is currently the only active Haitian player in the NBA.

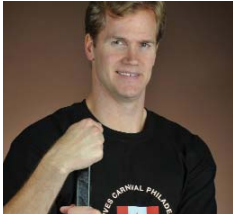


FIRFLY LITERACY FUND

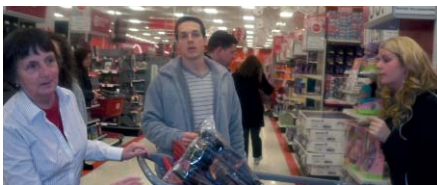
